Fall Q & A

These are some of the common questions we have been asked this fall.

- **Why are the ponds low?** The lower ponds are down to allow our staff to replace the rusted out dam supports in both ponds on hole 27. The irrigation pond between holes 8/17 and 11/12 is down and dyed blue so we could track a leak. This time of year we choose to not run the well to fill it back up and will wait for mother nature.
- **What is the white fuzz?** In spring we have cottonwood trees on holes 9 and 20 that leave fuzz, but in fall the fuzz is from a bumper crop of milkweed. The monarch butterflies love the milkweed, but the seeds do leave a aesthetic mess on windy days. Fortunately they are just about done flying around for this year.
- **When will the course close for the year?** We would love to stay open until late December but we close when the weather is no longer conducive for most people to play golf. It has been as early as Nov 4th and as late as December 2nd.
- **When did you aerify greens?** Fortunately for fall golfers, we aerify in summer to help with kwick healing and provide for better greens through the end of summer and fall.
- **What are the golf rates for 2023?** Those are still to be determined but the proposed rates can be found [here](#).
- **Where are the tee markers?** In early and late season we allow customers to tee off where they want. This spreads out the wear on the tees and reduces staff time moving the 222 tee markers.
